Carrying the coin at all times and presenting it when "challenged", to prove affiliation with the Unit, resulted in consequences for those who could not produce a coin; most popular required the coinless soldier to buy a round of drinks! This practice continues still today!


"WI Rustic Roads"

Remember, "Life isn't always beautiful, but it's a beautiful, "RIDE"!







A few tips for that trip

I've found a few things from that might be helpful to our members that might be taking longer trips this season. It would be making a inexpensive and compact first aid kit that would consist of the following.

First aid ointment

Eye wash or eye drops (especially if you have allergies)

Some type of first aid tape (water proof)

Tweezers

Strip thermometer (to monitor for heat stroke, if above 102 seek medical help asap)

Lip balm and sunscreen

Adhesive bandages of various sizes

Alcohol wipes

Mending kit (needle and thread)

Anti-itch ointment or cream and anti-fungal cream

11- Bandana (for a sling, binding, temporary tourniquet, pressure dressing)

Non drowsy allergy medication (instant melt kind)

General non-drowsy pain medication (instant melt kind)

Several pairs of surgical non-latex gloves.

Place these items in a heavy duty zip lock bag in fact I would double bag so if the outer bag gets tore or if you need a bag for disposal of items,

You may want to include an ace bandage, a ice pack, and some mosquito repellant, all these items are available at most drug stores. As with all items check and make sure the expiration date is not overdue.

Another thing to consider is having a contact card on you in case of an unfortunate incident, You may have heard the acronym (ICE) in case of emergency. This would include basic information for first responders to treat, and contact the people that you would have listed. I've researched online for these cards there are some pretty fancy ones that you can by but in my opinion a simple index card in the wallet or purse would work as well. There also is a app that can be put on your phone with the same info and your phone in the settings can be set for anybody to open to retrieve this info also.
